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Interview Project

You will work in pairs on the interview-presentation project. Topic of your presentation is 「ゆめの日本旅行」"A dream trip to Japan." Using the information you obtain from the interview you conduct with a Japanese speaker, you will plan a trip to his/her hometown in Japan. You will also need to research on the internet to gather more information about the city, and prepare a power point presentation.

Note: Make sure that both of you in the pair will be involved in all the following steps together.

Step 1	Project pairs	Decide who you will work with and email me. I will send you the
Step 1	due 10/23 Sat.	name of a Japanese person and his/her email address.
Step 2	Email the interviewee due 10/28 Th.	Make an appointment by <u>emailing to your interviewee in Japanese</u> . Forward or copy your message to me. First, introduce yourself and explain why you need to see him/her. Then ask when s/he has time to help you. You may send me a draft if
		you want me to check what you wrote before you send it.
Step 3	Interview preparation	Create initial interview questions.
Step 4	Interview due 11/12 Fri.	Spend at least 30 minutes. Try to get as much information as possible using only Japanese. Here are some of the Dos and Don'ts:
		Do not just show your written questions and expect your partner to answer. You must orally ask questions. Do not ask questions in English or ask your partner to answer in English. Respond to what s/he says and ask further questions based on his/her response. Thank the interviewee very politely (and don't forget to bow!).
Step 5	Interview reflection due11/15 Mon.	Turn in the interview reflection sheet.
Step 6	Research	Research more about the town using the internet. You may email the interviewee to ask further questions too.
Step 7	Power point	Create Power point presentation.
Step 8	Practice	Practice makes perfect!
Step 9	Presentations 12/2 Thu. & 12/3 Fri.	It is important that your classmates understand the content of your presentation. If your presentation includes vocabulary your classmates may not know, include vocabulary translation in slides. Presentations should be about 8-10 minute long.
